## Did you know?

**Naturalist interpretive programs are available statewide and may include:** guided nature walks and canoe trips, astronomy, fishing, campfire programs, natural history programs, crafts and performances by local musicians.

**Weddings:** Host your wedding ceremony or reception in one of over 40 unique locations across the state, naturally enhancing the beauty of an already special day.

**Other special events:** Vermont State Parks are great spots for family reunions, company outings, birthday parties and other group celebrations.

## Day use passes & discounts

**Vehicle passes** are available for the season; there is a discount for a second vehicle registered to the same person.

**Individual season passes** are also available. Season passes grant admission into any and all parks, all season long.

**Discounted punch cards** are good for 10 visits and don't expire.

**Special day use rates** may be available for municipal or school groups.

**Vermont seniors 62 and older, or Vermont veterans** who have been honorably discharged from active duty in the U.S. armed services, receive free day admission to all Vermont State Parks with a \$2 Green Mountain Passport (*available from town clerk's offices*).

## Camping and day use options

Reservations for campsites, cabins, cottages and day pavilions can be made up to 11 months in advance, either online or by phone. Sites for the whole month open up on the first business day of the month for most parks (15th of the month for Burton Island). **Reservations are risk-free**, so if you need to cancel, just call to reschedule before 2:00 p.m. the day before you are due to arrive.

### Campsites

Choose from a tent/RV site, lean-to or remote site at 38 parks, each with picnic table and fire ring. Most parks have hot and cold running water and hot showers.



### Cabins and Cottages

Cabins and/or cottages are available in 14 parks. Cabins are cozy one-room units that sleep up to 4 people. Cottages are fully outfitted rental houses and sleep 4-6 people. Both come with picnic table and fire ring.



### Day Pavilions

24 parks have day pavilions to rent by reservation that can accommodate groups of up to 300 people. Popular venues for weddings, family reunions and corporate picnics, these pavilions also have group-sized grills and most have electricity.



### Rental Boats

Rowboats, canoes, one- and two-person kayaks are available by the hour at lakeside parks. Pedal boats and stand up paddleboards start at a half-hour rentals.



### Dogs

Pets are allowed in all campgrounds but not in cabins or cottages. Pets are prohibited in day use areas and most beaches, but there are a few exceptions. Learn more at vtstateparks.com.



### Winter Use

Visitors are welcome to enjoy the parks in winter, both for day use and camping. Restrooms and water are not available in the off-season, but admission is free. A permit is required for winter camping.
